# Anti-LAMP-2 Antibody Seropositivity in Children with Primary Systemic Vasculitis Affecting Medium- and Large-Sized Vessels

Chronic primary systemic vasculitis (PSV) comprises a group of heterogeneous diseases that are broadly classified by affected blood vessel size, clinical traits, and the presence (or absence) of anti-neutrophil cytoplasmic antibodies (ANCA). The results of this study demonstrate particularly high prevalence and concentration of lysosome-associated membrane protein-2 (LAMP-2)-ANCA in chronic PSV that affects large blood vessels and is seronegative for traditional ANCA. ## Canadian Science Gets Biggest Boost to PhD and Postdoc Pay in 20 Years Nature



Researchers in Canada got most of what they were hoping for in the country's 2024 federal budget, with a big boost in postgraduate pay and more funding for research and scientific infrastructure. Stipends for master's students will rise from \$17,500 to \$27,000 per year, PhDs stipends that ranged from \$20,000 to \$35,000 will be set to a uniform annual \$40,000, and most postdoctoral-fellowship salaries will increase from \$45,000 to \$70,000 per annum.
